# The 3rd Thursday In July

is the date of the Midwest's biggest and most famous charcoal Chicken Broil in picturesque Manchester, Michigan. Beginning at 4:00 p.m. this annual event draws some 12,000 guests who flock to the Alumni Athletic Field southeast of Main Street in this small town on the River Raisin.

Mounted police direct traffic to the free parking areas, while 600 volunteers from the Manchester area, headed by the local civic groups, man the four 100-foot charcoal broiling pits and prepare to serve the complete chicken dinners.
